Ad material can be emailed in Adobe InDesign, TIFF, EPS, Word or PDF formats.

Full color available ... \$300 per ad insertion

Ad copy deadline:

- Noon Friday for ads that require production.
- 10 a.m. Monday for ads that are fully "camera-ready" and require no production.

Classified ad rates:

Free to individuals and nonprofits; for others \$12 up to 20 words; 40¢ each additional word.

Political ad rates:

\$15 per column inch; payment in advance. All political ads must include name and address of the person or organization paying for the ad.

Public notice ad rates:

\$3 per column-line for first publication
\$2.25 per column-line for subsequent publications.

No fee for publication affidavits.

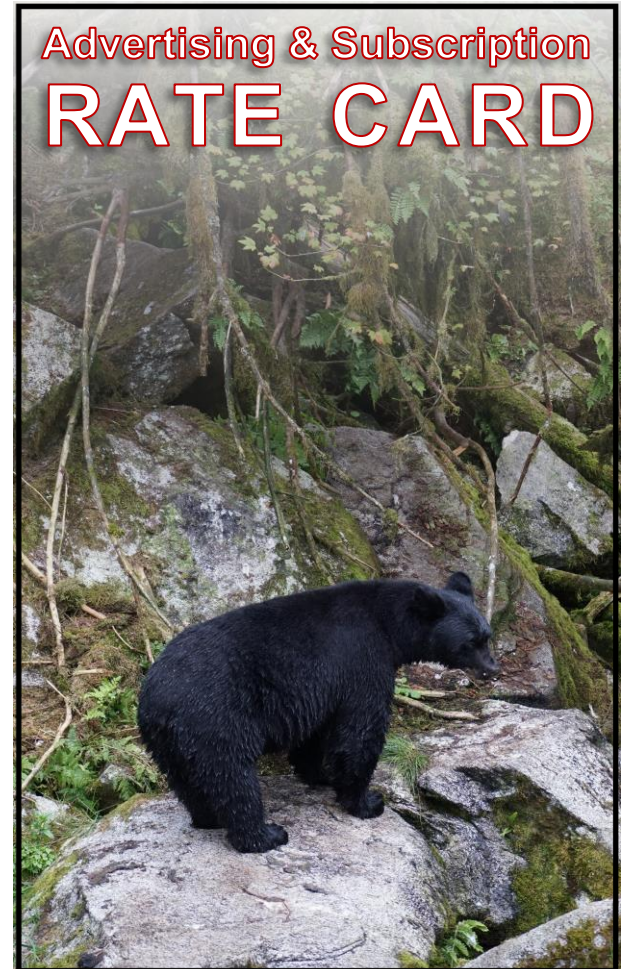
Paid circulation:

Obituaries:

The Sentinel does not charge for obituaries that do not exceed 400 words. The family can submit the obituary, which the Sentinel will assist by editing, or the family can submit the information and Sentinel staff will write the obituary. No charge for a photograph with the notice. The Sentinel will charge for notices longer than 400 words, with the rate dependent on the length and the format requested by the family.

The Sentinel reserves the right to charge an additional 20% fee for all advertising requiring heavy composition. Earlier deadlines of one day required.



Bears visit Anan Creek to feast on salmon every summer.

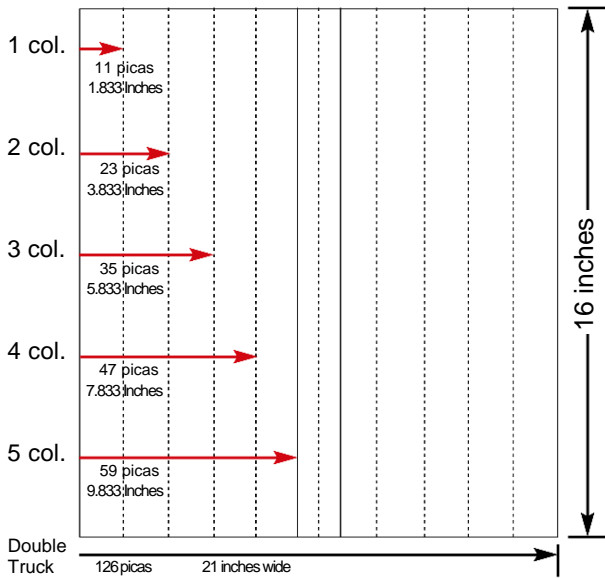

Wrangell Sentinel history

The Wrangell Sentinel — Alaska's oldest continuously published newspaper — was founded on Nov. 20, 1902. It was originally named the Alaska Sentinel.

A dozen owners over the past 120-plus years have seen the paper through the Klondike Gold Rush, the Depression, the downturn in the timber industry and two fires.

The 1906 fire wiped out most of Wrangell's business district, including the Sentinel office. While most of the Sentinel's stock and equipment were destroyed in the fire, the publisher was able to salvage enough printing equipment to print its weekly edition on butcher paper using red butcher ink.

The Sentinel has persevered through economic downtimes and good times, and plans to be around for a long time.

And now, all that history is preserved. A free searchable online database of papers going back to 1898 is maintained by Wrangell's Irene Ingle Public Library and is available at wrangellnewspapers.andornot.net.
